The Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy

AWARDED ANNUALLY TO THE WINNER OF THE HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP EIGHT RACE

The St. Catharines rowing fraternity has an expensive problem on its hands. In fact, it runs in the neighborhood of \$100,000.

The crux of the problem is the Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy, that magnificent Amar Khayyam wine jug awarded each summer to the crew that wins the high school championship eight race at the Canadian Secondary Schools Rowing Association Regatta held here.

For years, the ancient gold and silver trophy has carried a price tag of anywhere up to \$10,000. on it. But now a positive evaluation of the antique jug has been made. And on today's market it has a value of "in excess of \$100,000."

IN MEMORY

The trophy was presented to rowing in 1945 by the late William B. Cleland in memory of his youngest son, Calder, who was killed over Sicily while serving with the RCAF.

Mr. Cleland, who was in the wine-making business in St. Catharines, is thought to have found the Omar Khayyam wine jug during his forays into antique shops while on one of his numerous trips to England.



BEARS LEGEND

Back in 1945, the wine jug, equipped with a wooden base, sets out the legend on a silver plaque — "This wine jug, a creation of the Goldsmiths and Silver-smiths of England was presented by the guild to the Princess Eugenie upon her accession to the Throne of France in 1853, as Empress of Napoleon III. It also bears another silver plaque naming it the "Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy".

The jug is 30 inches high, is of sterling silver embossed in part with gold, and delicately covered with a leaf design superimposed by a fusing process. An engraving of small boys setting out on a hunt with hunting dogs is to be seen on one side, and on the other, the same small boys, with one dog, a dead stag, drinking wine and celebrating. Its handle is entwined with tails from the winged dragons which top it.

Oarsmen, unaware of its value have left it teetering on the water's edge, standing unguarded in front of grandstands, decorating high school lobbies and shipped unguarded across the country and into the United States when won by various high school Catharines oarsmen.

This prestigious jug will be awarded annually at C.S.S.R.A. regattas held here in St. Catharines for the victors in the high school championship eight race.

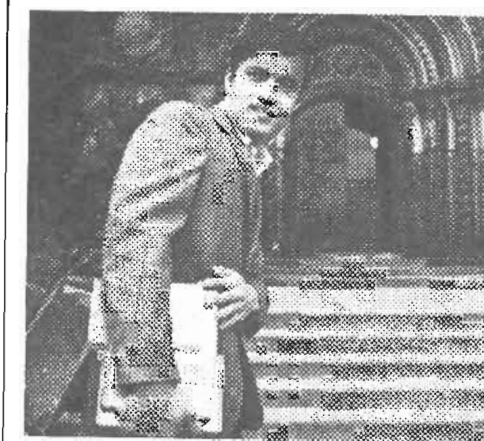

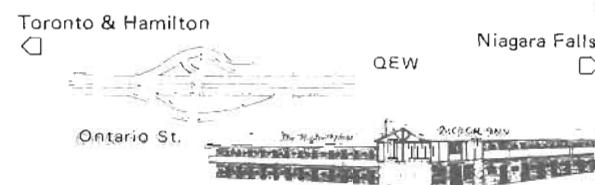
