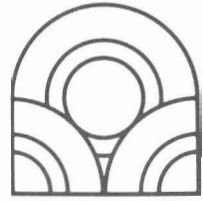

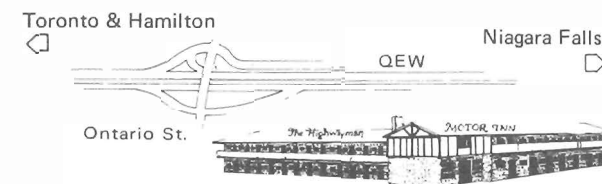
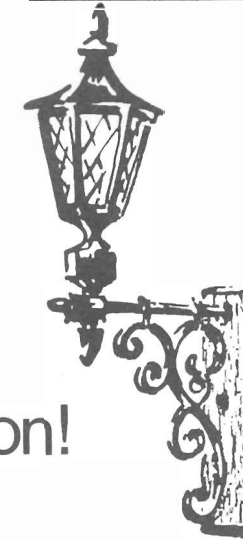

## The Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy

AWARDED ANNUALLY TO THE WINNER OF THE HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP EIGHT RACE

The St. Catharines rowing fraternity has an expensive problem on its hands. In fact, it runs in the neighborhood of \$100,000.

The crux of the problem is the Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy, that magnificent Amar Khayyam wine jug awarded each year to the crew that wins the high school championship eight race at the Canadian Secondary Schools Rowing Association Regatta held here.

For years, the ancient gold and silver trophy has carried a price tag of anywhere up to \$10,000. on it. But now a positive evaluation of the antique jug has been made. And on today's market it has a value of "in excess of \$100,000."
